Introduction

Teen's Track is a framework developed by **Heaven Tree Philanthropic Service Forum**, for helping Teen-agers and young people to cope with the struggles they are facing, in the present World. This program is designed on the basis of our preliminary exploration of the Schools in and around Thiruvananthapuram city to identify the challenges faced by teens today which indicated the crucial need for enhancing mental health/stability of the young people in our Schools to bring about a positive impact. Stakeholder consultations to develop a strategic plan to shape the future of teens led us to consensus on the need for focused approaches, to maximise the impact and emphasised on various inter related issues to be resolved. We locked down on a three pronged approach for addressing the challenge:

- Actively promote good 'stability' among Teen-agers and young people to make them mentally balanced, providing support for addressing the Psycho-social problems faced by them.
- Target the potentially vulnerable, due to poor/disintegrated families etc whose needs are often unnoticed or ignored and whose long-term soundness are under risk
- Consolidate, develop and expand core supports for providing attention to Teenagers and young Peoples issues and provide supports for overall development.

Teens' Track project will be Heaven Tree's flagship program with the intention to champion the needs of Teen-agers and young people's stability at all times and direct public attention towards key issues to achieve positive impact.

Why is our work significant?

We organised several psychosocial intervention programs in selected Schools in and around Trivandrum city, with the support of a Team of Experts. Application of standardized self-esteem inventory to learn their current mental status and several interactive sessions with students exposed various pertinent issues demanding interventions. The school authorities and PTAs applauded our initiative, as it helped to identify many problems, seeking solutions. Some key findings are summarised below.

- The scholastic performance and achievement of majority of the students in Govt and aided schools falls below average. Efforts of School authorities to motivate them, could not produce expected results.
- Poor performance and behavioural issues often pointed out to deprived family situations.
- Alcoholism, drug addiction, smoking habits among the students are on the rise.. School authorities are concerned and anxious to address this issue.



- Teachers are willing to support students but they may need professional support and training to tackle the situation.
- It is very important to have 'Guidance and Counselling Centres" in schools and colleges, with trained Teachers, to "catch them young" and mend them with timely supports.

To realise these ambitions **Heaven Tree** will continue to actively involve in Psycho Social Counselling and related interventions in Schools interested .
