

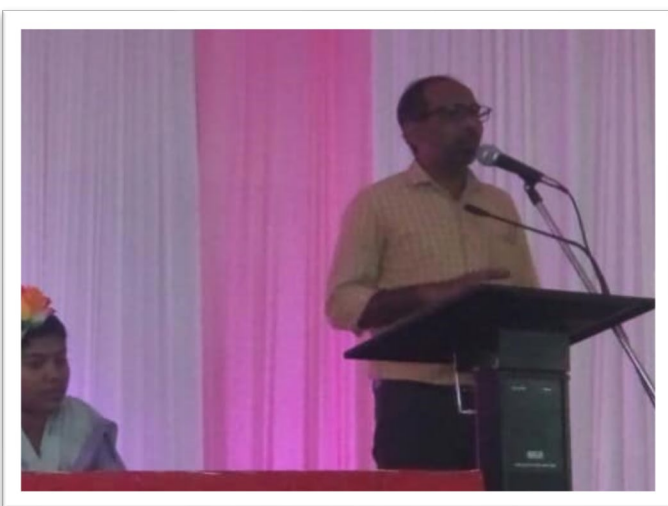
Activity report of womens study unit 2017-18

The guest of honor was Dr. A G Oleena who has carved a niche for herself as an academician cum activist with her caliber to standing out towering figure among the predominantly male social activists. The ceremonial welcome speech was delivered by the honorable principal, Sri A H Badrudeen who considered the opportunity to warmly welcome the guest as his privilege, and profusely commented on the admirable qualities of the dignitary on the dais.
