INTRODUCTION

Mannaniya College of Arts and Science, affiliated to the University of Kerala, is established in 1995. This co-educational institution is aided by the Government of Kerala and has also been recognized as an Institution with the Minority Status by National Commission for Minority Educational Institutions. The college has been included in the 2(f) and 12(B) categories of UGC since 2004. The college offers 4 UG programmes and 1 PG programme under the regular aided scheme. The UG and PG students are admitted to programmes based on the centralized allotment system of the University of Kerala. 1. Ladies Retiring Room


The college authority allowed a new room as ladies retiring room. This provides necessary facilities for girl students of the college including wash rooms and napkin vending machines.



2. Ramps and Rails

As per the directions of IQAC, a ramp is built in the main building of the College. Rails are also installed so that the movement of the disabled persons becomes more convenient.





3. Health and Fitness Club

The Physical Education department started a new club named 'Health and fitness Club'. The club provides healthy tips to the staff and students college by measuring their body mass index. Aerobics classes are provided to the lady staffs and students of the college in the evenings. A Multi Gym is also functioning in the college under the Health Club.





4. Orientation and Refresher Programmes

Orientation and Refresher programmes are necessary for the career improvement of teachers. The college takes initiative in giving applications to these courses by the staffs and eight teaching staffs completed orientation and refresher programmes. Shijina A.S, Dr Anvarshah and Dr Shiji Fazil attended Orientation programmes, Sri Asseem J, Smt Mumthas S, Dr P Nazeer, Dr Dilshad Bin Ashraf and Smt Jasmin J completed Refresher Programmes. Besides these, Dr P Nazeer attended a short term course organized by HRDC, University of Kerala.

5. FLAIR Membership

FLAIR is the programme offered by the Department of Collegiate Education, Kerala to improve the academic benefits. Dr.Shijina A.S, Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce is selected as FLAIR member and undergoes FLAIR Orientation at Trivandrum and ten days Induction Training at Bangalore.

6. New Certificate Courses

As per the directions of IQAC, the Department of Arabic introduced a new certificate course named "Communicative Arabic". The Department of Commerce started the Course "Income Tax Law and Practice". The Creativity Hub commenced a Certificate Course in Spoken English named "Let's Talk". All the three courses are started classes during the academic year 2018-19.

7. Open Air Auditorium

Mannaniya Mates (College Alumni) sponsored an open air auditorium in the college. The foundation stone laying for the auditorium was done at the Alumni meet on 11-08-2018.



8. Club Activities and Flood Relief

NSS Unit conducted different programmes such as Teachers Day Celebratios, Flood Relief Initiatives, etc. A Sub Collection Centre is opened in the college on 17-08-2018 and the collected materials are distributed at the most flood affected villages- Kuttanadu and Chengannur.

The relief measures are made in three phases. On the first phase, National Service Scheme, Mannaniya Mates, WWS, Nature Club and ED Club organized a collection centre in the Mannaniya College on 17th and 18th August 2018. We collected the needy materials such as food materials, medicines, lotions, dress and drinking water. On 19th all the collected materials were distributed to the **relief camps of Chengannur**.

The second phase collection was made on 19th and 20th August 2018 and the relief materials were distributed in the **camps of Kuttanad**. NSS programme officer Asseem.J, and other volunteers such as Muzammil, JagfarKhan, Ashik, Muhammed Sha, Unais Rawther and Ijas distributed the relief materials to the various flood affected relief camps.

Our students Muzammil, Adil, Ajas, Jagfarkhan, Ijas and Shereena participated as volunteers in the **Collection Centre**, **SMV School**,

Trivandrum on 18th August 2018. On 24th August, 2018 Muzammil participated in the collection centre functioning at Nishagandhi Auditorium, Trivandrum.

In the third phase, an amount of Rs one lakh is collected from the staffs, students, PTA and alumni and it is donated to the Chief Minister's Flood Relief fund.







9. Orientation Programme

An orientation class by Dr.M.R.Sudarsana Kumar is arranged on 26-09-2018 for criterion file verification. The class helps in verification of all criterion files according to the new SSR format. He created awareness on maintenance of files in a systematic way. On the basis of the comments of the external report (Dr,M.R Sudarsana Kumar), the modification works are made on 11-10-2018, 12-10-218 and 13-10-2018.

10. Canteen Building

Due to the lack of facilities in the present canteen building, a new building is allowed by the college authorities. The construction work of the building is started and it is completed in the May 2018.

21. Wildlife Photography and Posture Exhibition





Industrial Visit- KINFRA International Apparel Park, TVPM

ED Club of Mannaniya College of arts and science, Pangode in association with DIC (District Industries centre) organised an industrial visit at KINFRA Park Thiruvananthapuram on 24th November 2018(8 am to 5 pm).

It was very useful to all members and it was considered as a motivational visit. Total 31 participants have participated including 25 ED Club members (students) three teachers co-ordinating and accompanying the student group (Dr. Jaseedha K, Associate professor of English, Dr. Anvarsha, Department of Arabic and Smt. Jasmin J, Coordinator of ED Club and assistant professor of commerce) and two officers from DIC (Mr. B Premlal, industries extension officer and Mr. Sunil Kumar, Assistant District officer, Nedumangadu).

KINFRA International Apparel Park is located at Thiruvananthapuram near Thumba to provide infrastructure and other related facilities for the garment manufacturing units. This Park is operated by KINFRA, a public sector agency of the government. Kerala Industrial Infrastructure Development Corporation (KINFRA) aims at empowering industrial growth within the state since 1993 and at bringing together all the suitable resources available in the state for developing infrastructure. KINFRA Park facilitates industrial infrastructure facilities which are available inside the park with international standards.





AYANS - Manufacturing unit

Firstly, we visited "Ayans", a manufacturing concern exclusively for nighties and night wears for ladies. The process of this manufacturing unit was briefly explained by Mr. Manu, the production manager. It was a small scale industry employing around 10 employees. It is a domestic business. They purchase raw materials from other states like Rajasthan and Gujarat. They completely and sustainably utilise their raw materials (cloth), the waste cloth cuttings are used for making floor mats. The unit is an example of a sustainable business idea implemented in a successful manner.





Amala Bakers and Confectionaries

Secondly, we visited "Amala bakers and Confectionaries", the manufacturing unit of bread and bun. They manufacture different verities of breads like sweet bread, milk bread, wheat bread etc. and buns like burger buns, cream buns

etc. It is a partnership firm and Mr. Sanjay Mathew, manager cum managing partner of Amala bakers and confectionaries explained in detail the various professional aspects of business including profitability, risk bearing, marketability etc. Most of the workers were women and they give job opportunities to economically weaker section of the society. The major process of producing bread and bun are operated mechanically with the help of machines. Packing work is done manually.







Goodwill Polymers

Then we visited "Goodwill polymers", which manufactures PVC Pipes, Water Tank, Septic Tank. Mr. Shaji, production manager of goodwill explained various process of manufacturing PVC Pipes and tanks. All the process of producing PVC Pipes and tanks are done with the help of high cost machines. The raw material used for making PVC Pipe is polyvinyl Chloride and a raw material used in Tank is linear Low density polythene lire. It is a famous manufacturing concern.











Alfas Lamination Pvt. Ltd

Lastly, we visited Alfas lamination Pvt. Ltd., their main business was laminating MTF Board used for making cupboards. Mr. Rajeesh, the plant manager explained the core activities in the manufacturing concern. The materials used the wood treatment and lamination process are imported from different countries like Singapore, Malessia etc. (lamination on wood) using glossy paper lamination on wood is the only activity in this factory and the

output is marketed in and around different districts of the state and is a profitable business. For the purpose of laminating MTF Board, an A/C Room is required as the coated or laminated paper process typically involves high temperature.

Some of the firms that operates within the ambiance of KINFRA are, Mathrubhoomi and the Hindu - news paper printing agency, Fresh N- Tissue paper factory, Merry boy ice cream factory, Indroyal Furniture Factory, designing and training centre, Vinvish technologies pvt. Ltd., Dry clan centres etc.

The visit was highly beneficial to the students as it facilitated in enhancing and updating their business skills for practical purpose. The sincere service provided by the DIC officers in the realisation of this visit was not only remarkable but also highly commendable.

The club comprised of 50 students from B.A,B.SC,B.Com and TTM department. It was formed to sensitize the importance of nature in this fast advanced globalised world. The aim of our college and Club is eco-friendly and plastic fee campus. The new members of the club were given by a warm welcome by the senior club members .They gave friendly talk regarding our work in progress. Nature club merged with WWS and NSS thus conducted a meeting for the students by the club coordinators for plastic free campus. They campaigned considering the mentioned topic.

As kerala witnessing a harsh and humid climate students were distributed saplings and growbag to make them grow in their home. Sukanya , Raihana and Abhiraj brought some plants after growing at home to college. Cabbage , Cheera, tomato, chillies were the vegetables grown by them. Regular watering and removal of weeds were done accordingly. Some ayurvedic herbs like "Aloevera, Kaiyonni, brahmi, vayambu were purchased from palode ayurvedic farm as part of herbal gardening. At the same time for gardening we purchased Melestomia, Rose, bougaivilla from evergreen nursery kallara. The best volunteers of the last academic year was given prize on college day and consolation prizes for the active members of the club.





A nature camp was organised on 23|1|2019. At Agri farm Peringamala. There were 55 students from the club for faculty members visited the farm. We started our journey at 10 am from the college and reached there at 11:30 am. There were two farm, firstly we reached Banana farm. There

we could see variety of banana cultivation. The entrance decorated with different kinds of flowers and fruits. Spending some time there and collecting information regarding the cultivation from the officer Maya. We moved to Jilla farm(Jilla Krishi Thottam). There we were welcomed by the agriculture officer Suresh Kumar. The entire history of the farm was shared by the officer. He said that it was established in 1964 as a single unit and later split into two as 'banana farm' and 'Jilla Krishi Thottam'. A 'waste to energy plant' is to be set inside the farm but the proper place is not yet identified by the government. 'Samara Panthal' is set up by the native dwellers to protest the mission of the government as the place is unfit for such a project were lives thousands of people. The officer reported that there is no empty area to set up this life warning project as the farm is fully under cultivation. He walked along with us to show their cultivation. They use only organic waste as fertilizer for the growth of plants. We could see passion fruit in its initial stage, cocoa plants bearing fruits, hybrid Jampa, Sapotta, Coconut, different species of Jack Fruit tree etc. A stream and pond to freshen the mind and body of visitors and the peoples there. There were saplings of bud like Thailand

Jampa, Jack fruit, Mango Trees, Rambuttan, Njara etc and vegetables like Brinjal, chillies, tomatoes, aloevera and the like. There were also rich garden setting. Beginning from the Orchid and Rose we can end up by 10 'O' clock flower. We had a grand lunch from the farm canteen departed from there at 3 pm.

Gender gap in science is an enigma or mystery which baffles the academia for a considerable time. According to many statistics and data there is huge gender gap in the field of science and technology. (Only 14%, women is the where as the global average is 28.4% in the field of Science is a proof to hypothise Science is considered generally as a male profession. (In IIT only 10% are women and merely 5% Science fellowships are awarded to women in India.)

To identify the qualitative factors that pull back women from STEM even in this millennium and seek solutions to bring parity is the need of the hour in this digitalera that shows a surge of interest everywhere in developing scientific technology. Therefore, the ingenious girls of B.Sc Chemistry belonging to the group were assigned with the mission of attempting to solve this enigma. They were first instructed to do a literature survey of eminent women scientists of international acclaim, along with their Indian counterparts. This was to inspire them immensely, lest they might be dispirited by the demotivating nature of the task assigned to them. Then they were made to select diverse areas pertaining to the different fields of Science, and trace the reasons and factors that leads to the under representation

of women scientists compared to male scientists, and that deter them so much from pursuing promising careers in science. It is believed that there is a lack of women in academia related to Science Technology. Do the severe strains involved or the potential challenges or any other difficulties faced by women scientists hinder them in preferring and pursuing the male-dominated domain of science? They were asked to focus on identifying the impediments, barriers and issues faced by most women scientists driven by societal gender stereotypes, especially in technical and IT fields. There are less opportunities and more impediments to balance their work-home paradigm as the field demands consistent commitment without flexibility that are deterring many capable women from investing on careers in Science. Hence, with the noble

view of changing and challenging this perspective, to improve the status of women in science and to instill passion in the young science students to break this barrier, they were asked to trace the life stories and career path of women scientists who emerged successful from the nation, especially from their state. Some women had successfully broken the myths and barriers to engrave their names in the myriad fields of Science. Are there any road blocks to success which steer women away from a scientific career or from pursuing their passion for science? Does gender matters in Science? These are some of the issues that need to be traced and corrected.

There are lot of gaps in history books which needs to be filled for getting a complete picture of our past. One such gap is the role played by women which is left unsaid in almost all books of history. It is the duty of all students of history to contribute their part to complete these gaps by their own research. One such area is the life and social history of the socially invisible women, especially of those belonging to the Muslim Community. As young students of Islamic History too they are obliged to contribute to this specific area so as to fill the gaps and lending a sense of completeness to our books of history, as well as contributing to the knowledge domain.

As the particular information was lacking in the printed books on history the students were asked to do research through the mode of oral history by documenting personal experiences of their older generations by gathering information from people personally, through anecdotes, to understand and recreate the past and record it for the future generation. It is an attempt to recreate women's life, customs, leisure, time activities, food habits, ceremonies and celebrations,

dressing style and ornaments, lifestyle, modes of communication, literary taste, reading habits, means of entertainment, (music, dance, etc) in the last century. Each student, after splitting them into small groups, was assigned a specific topic in these areas so as to cover all the aspects of their social life comprehensively. The final output when completed successfully as proposed would be an original contribution to our history to the present and future generations, as it intended to be published as book.

The students were provided guidance in each stage asked to conduct a background study of the age before starting the research to prepare an appropriate and probing questionnaire. They were also instructed to properly document the source of information.

Walk With a Scholar (WWS) Programme

Walk With a Scholar (WWS) is an initiative of Higher Education Department ,Govt of Kerala, started in the academic year 2012-13. This scheme proposes to arrange specialized mentoring programs for students in under graduate to provide guidance for their future. The scheme introduces the idea of mentoring and builds on the concept of mentor as a 'Guide' and 'Friend'. The mentoring scheme for students will be purely voluntary in nature. It will be open for all students entering the first year of the under graduate programme of study. The Scheme aims at giving necessary orientation to needy students, to prepare them for employment and give them necessary guidance, motivation and necessary

mental support to identify appropriate areas for higher study as well as employment. The mentoring scheme should be planned to identify the opportunities available for the scholars, the areas suitable for them, the manner in which the scholar should proceed before them and evolve ways by which they can be acquired. The scheme involves internal mentoring, external mentoring, motivational visit to reputed educational institutions, leadership camps, internship with civil servants etc. The scheme started in aided college in the year 2014-15. We gave the proposal in the beginning year itself and the scheme is functioning well in our institution since 2014-15. Apart from internal mentoring and external mentoring we also organized and implemented creative initiatives like 5 O' Clock Club, Let's Talk English speaking course, palliative care programmes and mobile app development by Team Mulberry.

External Mentoring

The main weaknesses of the mentees are emotional imbalance, stage fear, Communication problem and Lack of confidence. External mentoring session was organized in such way that the mentees can overcome this kind of problems. The interactive session given by them gave more importance to solve the problem of stage fear, communication, confidence of mentees .Special Emphasis was given to motivate and create more confidence among mentees to avail better future opportunities. Legal awareness, Personality development, Career counseling, Orientation for preparing competitive examinations were the main activities of the external mentoring.

Invited Talk- Wild Life Tourism & Poster Exhibition



World Wet Land Day Celebrations 2019, Sponsored by KSCSTE on 05.02.2019 &06.02.2019



National Science Day celebrations 2019

National Science Day is celebrated all over India with great enthusiasm on 28th of February every year in order to commemorate the invention of the Raman Effect in India by the Indian physicist, Sir Chandrasekhara Venkata Raman on the same day in the year 1928. For his great success in the field of science in India, Chandrasekhara Venkata Raman was awarded and honored with the Nobel Prize in the Physics in the year 1930.

Malayalam Vedhi Activity Report 2018-2019






RED RIBBON CLUB 2018-19


